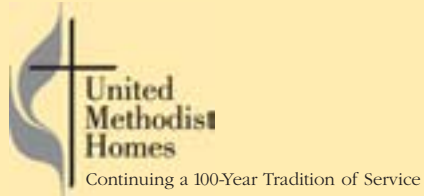

President's Message

United Methodist Homes continues to welcome more individuals and organizations to our extended family. Hospice of Northwest Connecticut, which provides trained volunteers to support terminally ill patients and their families, became an affiliated service of Sharon Health Care Center. To extend our tradition of service in the Hartford area, in March 2003 we purchased an assisted living residence in Newington, Connecticut that we have named Middlewoods of Newington.

Our award-winning Wesley Village in Shelton became the first senior community in the country to begin developing a model of senior living services that combines the strengths of United Methodist Homes with elements of the Planetree philosophy of patient-centered hospital care. Both Bishop Wicke Health Center and Sharon Health Care Center received deficiency-free ratings from CT Department of Public Health inspectors, meeting all nursing, dietary and safety standards. Crosby Commons remains the front-runner for the most "Best Practices" Awards ever received by a Connecticut assisted living community. A campaign is underway to fund improvements at the Wesley Heights retirement community, including more space for group activities and worship.

To provide additional options for seniors, we launched Senior Care Navigator, which provides professional care management to help seniors remain in their own homes. Counting our communities in Connecticut and our management contracts, United Methodist Homes ranks first nationally among non-profits in the number of assisted living units that we operate.

Throughout our history of caring for seniors, we have often seen the truth of the Biblical passage, "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it." Our 2002 Annual Report focuses on individuals who embody the concept of hospitality.

Here is a glimpse of a few of the many angels who account for the continued success of United Methodist Homes.

Frieda and Wesley Heights



“Today's activities include crafts at 9:30, prayer fellowship at 10, exercises at 11, and a 2:30 movie.” If you have ever visited the Wesley Heights retirement community around breakfast, you have, no doubt, heard announcements like this one, and you also probably know the community's unofficial “town crier,” Frieda Margolus. In August of 1994, Frieda moved into the Wesley Heights retirement community in Shelton after accompanying her relatives on a visit to this area. “I saw the layout here, and it appealed to me,” she states. “It had plenty of air and space, and even when I was growing up in Queens, I always had plenty of space.” She also wanted a community with Methodist connections and plenty of stimulating activities.

Almost nine years later, Frieda not only participates in activities, she also assumes a major role in welcoming strangers to Wesley Heights, as well as maintaining and encouraging connections between people. Her present activities include hosting the daily coffee hour, announcing the activities of the day at mealtimes, serving on the executive committees of the Wesley Heights Residents' Association and the Council of Friends of United Methodist Homes, as well as

helping to operate the Wesley Village Store. Wanting our tradition of care to remain strong for the future, Frieda made a gift that pays her a lifetime income and also contributes to the long-term financial stability of United Methodist Homes.

Frieda also shares what she calls “the wedding album,” which pictures the lives and marriages of her parents, children, grandchildren and extended family. She has already given the photos of herself as a child to her grandson and her two granddaughters, so that they have a piece of their family's past.

A woman who chronicles the past, updates us on the present, and provides for the future – the essence of hospitality!



Marion and Hospice of Northwest Connecticut

For Marion Reed, a relationship begins when she says, “I’m from Hospice. Would you like me to visit with you?” As one of the 35 volunteers with Hospice of Northwest Connecticut, she believes that “you don’t have to be a nurse to do hospice; it’s the kind word that helps people who are sick.”

A lifelong resident of the Northwest corner of Connecticut, Marion became involved in Hospice in 1982 after assisting with the care of her husband. An injury in the early 1990s made it difficult for her to climb stairs in clients’ homes. She then decided to continue her volunteer work at Sharon Health Care Center, where many patients receive hospice services.

She visits Sharon Health Care Center four or five times a week. Often her visits are short, depending on how a client is feeling. She may stop in to deliver a favorite newspaper or some freshly cut flowers. “I feel as if I am contributing by sitting there and listening to them talk,” she relates. Marion also speaks with gratitude of the things that she’s learned as she listens to clients – from the fundamentals of baseball, to the elements of hat making, to the cultivation of geraniums.

Historically, a hospice served as a way station for travelers on a long journey. Today, hospice is a philosophy of care that aids travelers at the last stage of life’s journey. As a volunteer who has been with Hospice of Northwest Connecticut for more than two decades, Marion is aware that every client is different, but that our desire to love and to be loved connects us all.

Dave, Jeri and Middlewoods of Farmington

Dave and Jeri Nagel consider themselves experts in the field of assisted living. When Olive, Dave's mother, arrived at Middlewoods of Farmington in August 2000, Dave, Jeri and Olive had already toured numerous facilities in both Arizona and Connecticut. "They say that when you walk in the door of a place, you'll know whether it's right or not," recalls Dave. "We walked into the lobby at Middlewoods, and my mom was already nodding her head to say that this was her choice. Our only problem is that we ourselves can't move there – at least not yet!"

Jeri works as a job developer helping unemployed persons train for and procure jobs. Dave works as a high school English teacher and was

formerly a longtime dramatics advisor at East Hartford High School. They volunteer and serve on the boards of several organizations, including the 57-year old Repertory Theatre of New Britain, where they also employ their directing, stage managing and acting talents in comedies, classic dramas and musicals. Since Olive moved to Middlewoods of Farmington three years ago, the residents have attended the plays with regularity.

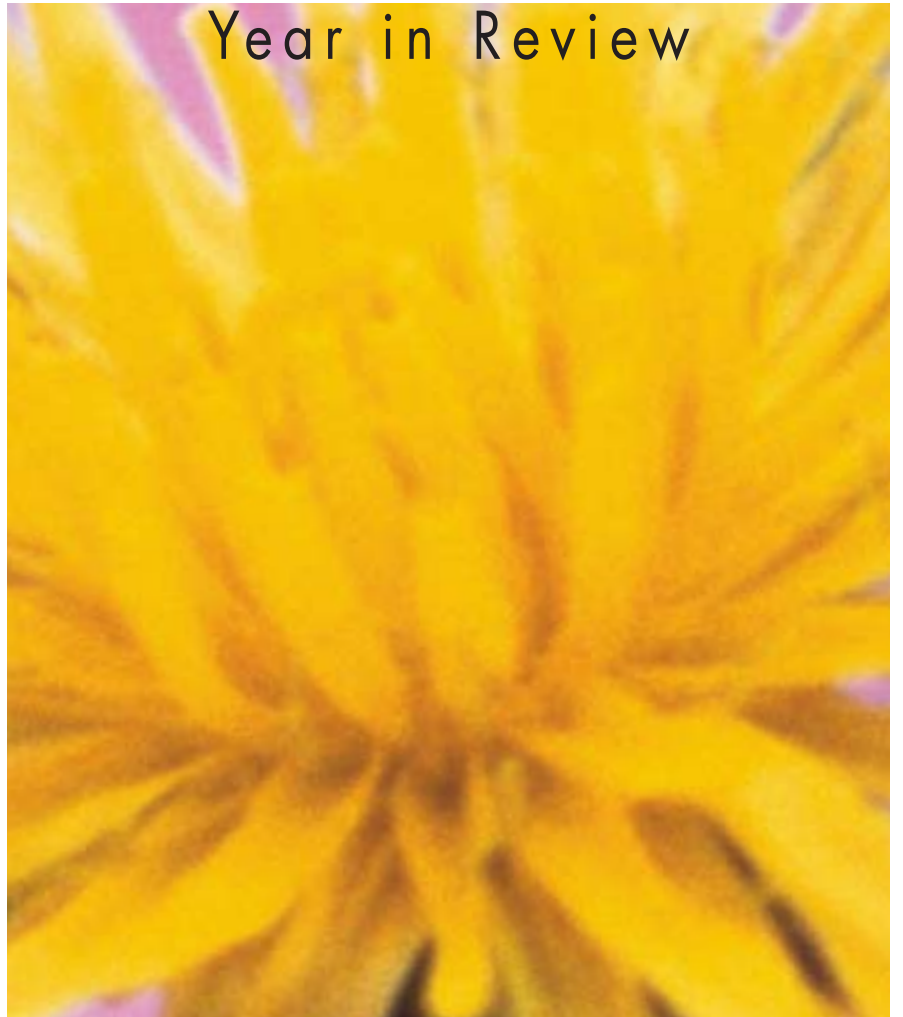
The couple's involvement extends beyond entertainment and activities. Through her position at Mid-Connecticut Works, Jeri has helped to place a number of employees at Middlewoods of Farmington. Her standard is simply, "if Olive would like them, then they are good candidates to recommend."

Jeri and Dave's love of entertaining and common sense approach to hospitality helps bring people together, benefiting all those within the Middlewoods of Farmington community.

As is inevitably the case, hospitality enriches the lives of both the receiver and the giver, both guest and host. Its dynamic nature is central to the work of United Methodist Homes, giving us all an appreciation for our shared experiences – living and working among angels.

Wesley Village

- Wesley Village became the first senior community in the country to begin developing a model of senior living services that combines the strengths of United Methodist Homes with elements of the Planetree philosophy of patient-centered hospital care
- Bishop Wicke Health Center provided skilled nursing care to 242 residents, with 174 returning home after rehabilitation
- Bishop Wicke Health Center provided Alzheimer's care to 41 residents and hospice services to more than 50 residents and their families
- Following rigorous inspections, Bishop Wicke Health Center received a deficiency-free rating from CT Department of Public Health inspectors, meeting all nursing, dietary and safety standards
- Crosby Commons provided assisted living to 88 residents. The facility enjoyed a high level of resident satisfaction and received two additional Best Practices Awards from the 80-member CT Assisted Living Association
- The Wellness Center, operated in conjunction with Sacred Heart University's Department of Physical Therapy, served 112 members from Wesley Village and the community, providing exercise classes, strength and balance training, and aquatherapy in a heated pool
- Wesley Heights maintained full occupancy while providing affordable retirement living for 242 residents
- To protect the health of residents and employees, Wesley Village is testing and converting to non-toxic cleaning products throughout its facilities
- In June, United Methodist Homes presented its Senior Wisdom Awards to 28 men and women from 19 towns who continue to contribute in significant ways to their local communities

- Wesley Heights resident Effie Hobby, age 105, who has voted in every election since women were given the right to vote, received a congratulatory call from First Lady Laura Bush after the November election
- 150 registered volunteers, ranging in age from 12 to 91, donated a total of 9,400 hours of service at Wesley Village
- The Council of Friends, with more than 275 members, enhanced the quality of resident life by buying equipment, sponsoring entertainment and promoting the Christmas gift program

- Middlewoods served 95 residents during the year. Of the current residents, 65% use the on-site UCONN physician as their primary doctor
- 75% of residents participate in the daily exercise program
- 13 seniors came to Middlewoods for short-term respite stay
- Middlewoods received a Best Practices award from the CT Assisted Living Association
- Satisfied families and professional caregivers continue to refer most new residents

Sharon Health Care Center

- Following rigorous inspections, Sharon Health Care Center received a deficiency-free rating from the CT Department of Health inspectors, meeting all nursing, dietary and safety standards
- Sharon Health Care Center celebrated its Tenth Anniversary with a series of events for residents, their families and community leaders
- The lobby and all of the lounges and corridors in the building were redecorated with new carpeting, wallpaper and artwork
- Sharon Health Care Center provided skilled care to a total of 237 residents, with 103 returning home after rehabilitation
- 36 children received care onsite at the Beginning Years Children's Center
- Hospice of Northwest Connecticut became an affiliated program, serving 27 families during 2002

- We launched this new community service, which provides professional care management to help seniors remain in their own homes

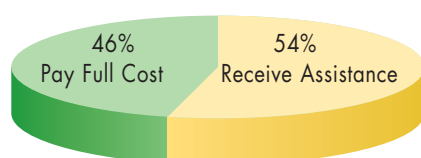

The Annual Fund exceeded \$231,500, an increase of 8% over the prior year. Several hundred new donors contributed, and there were 67 Leadership Level (\$1,000+) gifts.

The Annual Fund helps fund services not fully covered by fees and government reimbursement, such as:

- Special care for Alzheimer's patients
- Daily exercise and activity programs for residents with limited mobility
- Hospice of Northwest Connecticut
- New equipment and improvements at the facilities, such as redecorating Sharon Health Care Center and installing automatic doors at Middlewoods of Farmington

\$44,000 in Annual Fund gifts was designated for the planned renovations of the Wesley Heights retirement community. More than 230 gifts totaling \$104,000 were made to Sharon Health Care Center and Hospice of Northwest Connecticut.

Our Building for 21st Century Care Campaign received \$7,433 in contributions for Crosby Commons, the assisted living residence at Wesley Village. Since 1986, the Campaign has raised a total of \$2.3 million to establish Crosby Commons.

Charitable gift annuities that pay a lifetime income at attractive, guaranteed rates continue to be popular with our donors.

We received two bequests, ranging in size from \$25,000 to more than \$50,000, from the following donors:

- Ellen Brizzie of Wesley Heights
- Winston Corbett of Lakeville, Connecticut, designated for Hospice of Northwest Connecticut

All of this support helps us extend our hospitality to more seniors and their families.

The endowment of United Methodist Homes strengthens the quality of services that we are able to provide. Our current financial strength derives from many farsighted donors who made bequests and life income gifts that built our endowment over time.

A bequest to United Methodist Homes through your will may allow you to make a more substantial gift than would be possible during your lifetime. A bequest may be for a percentage of your estate or a specific amount. We recommend designating a percentage of your estate, thereby ensuring that all the beneficiaries of your estate, including charities, will receive the proportion you intend, even though your estate may change in value.

To make a bequest to United Methodist Homes, you should include the following statement in your will:

I give, devise and bequeath (state specifics of bequest here, e.g. 10% of my estate) to United Methodist Homes, Inc., 580 Long Hill Avenue, Shelton, Connecticut, 06484.

If you prefer, you may make your bequest to a specific service such as Hospice of Northwest Connecticut or Sharon Health Care Center.

Unrestricted bequests give United Methodist Homes the flexibility to use funds where they are most needed at the time. If you are considering a bequest with specific restrictions for its use, we encourage you or your attorney to discuss your plans with the development office, to ensure that we will be able to meet your intent.

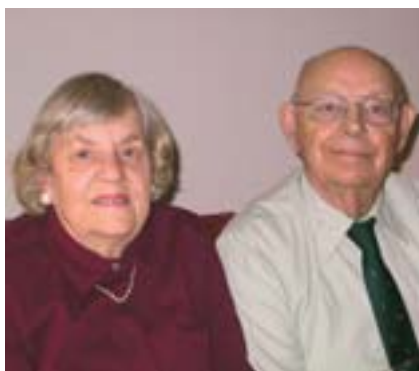

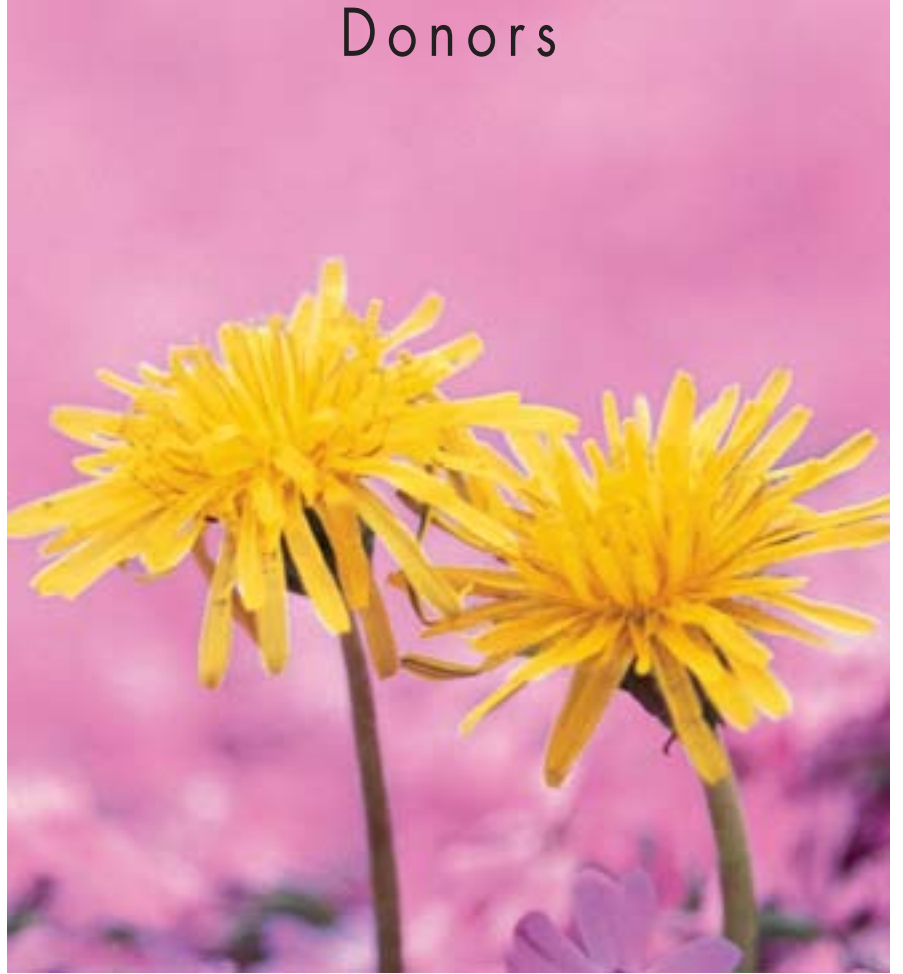
